To the Point

If January is the month of beginnings — vows, promises, resolutions to change, the dawn of a year — then December must be the month of endings. It is a simple but important truth that without an ending, there can be no beginning. December is a great month to ask, “What do I need to let go of so that I am free to grow into the new year?” We have all heard of that ingenious trick for capturing monkeys. A covered wooden box is tied to a tree, filled with small pieces of fruit. Next a small hole, just large enough for a monkey’s open hand to squeeze into, is drilled into the end. When the monkey comes, reaches in and grabs the small fruit, its fist becomes too large to pull out through the hole. If the monkey refuses to give up the fruit — which many do — it is captured and taken away.

History and Archives

Archives Committee has recently been reborn as the History & Archives Committee. Kit Alexander and John Wilder are heading up the newly formed group as chairs.

The major part of the Unitarian Church, Universalist Church and Unitarian Universalist Church of Waterville archives have been organized and completed. A finding guide is available. The Archives from 1826 to 1999 are in a fire-proof cabinet located in the elevator foyer on the Averill Parlors level. Records exist from 2000 until the present and are in the process of being organized in other file cabinets in the same area.

We plan to announce various projects as time goes on and hope you will join us. You can volunteer to do as much or as little as you want.

We’d like to make our history more available to our members. Do you have a question? If so, please let us know and we will try our best to help. We would also like to highlight various aspects of our history by way of The Point, church announcements and special programs.

Our first project involves the glass-top cabinet located in the sanctuary to the right of the ramp door. This cabinet was donated in 1969 by the Larsen Family along with members of the Universalist-Unitarian Church family and friends. The cabinet contains a lovely red leather “Book of Remembrance” dedicated to Otto and Helen Larsen. No names have been entered in the book, so we thought we would like to start this process. If you know of someone who was a member, friend or associated in some way with the church who has passed on, please let us know. Just send Kit or John an email with the person’s name and birth/death dates. We’d like to go back at least as far as 1969, but if you can provide information on someone before that date, please do.

We’ll keep you posted as projects come along...and will ask for help as needed. We’d really like to share our church’s rich history with everyone.

Evening Sandwich Program

With Maili’s permission I am posting parts of her last email to me and other ESP Board members about ESP numbers on the 4th afternoon of serving food since ESP re-opened. Her comments capture the deep satisfaction that comes with working in tandem with local sister organizations in this time of COVID. *Connie Winship*

Well, well, well! Today we started with a ton of food! I had asked the Friday crew to cut down on the amount of food they prepare because numbers were down, but they couldn't help themselves and we had a lot of PBJs and bologna and cheese.

Unexpectedly, the Food Pantry delivered chili, corn muffins, carrot sticks with dip and coleslaw, and a few loaves of banana bread with chocolate chips; Colby volunteers brought sandwiches, stir-fry with tofu, soups and various other things.

Given that the most number of people we’ve served since we reopened ESP three weeks ago was 17 and that we served only 9 people on one of the three days we were open, we thought...well, we thought we had too much food!

We were wrong! At the end of the hour, we’d served 36 people a total of 107 meals! This was encouraging given that our totals for the three weeks had been VERY LOW, i.e. 6, 9, 17.

Two people took meals for several people. We piled it on!

As it turned out there were still many PBJs left at the end of that day, but we did a great job of moving the bounty on! Maili Bailey
