"Spiritual Cartography"

Unitarian forefather, Ralph Waldo Emerson, once said that, "Life is a journey, not a destination."

Each of us have had a unique, and often winding, path.

Somewhere along the way, each of our journeys brought us to this congregation.

As Nikki Giovanni said in her poem ("A Journey") We are **fellow passengers**.

Learning and growing both individually and together.

One thing I have discovered is that while my path has had many alternating directions, turns, stops, starts and layers to it, it contains perpetual intersections.

Intersections where lessons held, principles passed through, and momentum that seemed to have faltered was only resting, waiting for better timing to emerge.

Waiting for clarity to accompany it at the threshold.

Enter:

The Rule of Saint Benedict.
A timeless document,
utilized almost in equal proportion by non-Catholics
as it offers people
an accessible plan for living a
balanced, simple, and prayerful life.

Although written for monks, the Rule can be applied to life in the world outside the monastic community.

The qualities which make up a valued life - humility, patience, simplicity, solitude, caring for others, and living in community -

- these are worthwhile for everyone.

The Rule revolves around five practices: Prayer, Work, Study, Hospitality and Renewal.

In August I spent a week in a contemplative setting with fellow seekers exploring *The Rule*: its individual practices, and though *not named so*, we explored our Spiritual Cartographies...

Both how our journeys led to participating in the cohort, And the places we discovered we were already practicing aspects (all or in part) of The Rule. I should back up to say that by the time I was in the summer ministerial cohort, I had already sketched out many of the topics and themes for our upcoming services here in Waterville.

I knew I would be preaching about Spiritual Cartography.

A topic where we were to explore ways humans predict, measure and reflect upon and make meaning of their spiritual journeys.

When I drafted the original outline, I anticipated touching upon several things: the various forms of astrology, for instance, rising signs and north nodes in particular offer indications regarding our **interests and aptitudes**. Sometimes uncannily so.

How personality tests such as *Myers Briggs* and *Clifton Strengths* can reveal our areas of **power and weakness** lending to our <u>successes and struggles</u> and help <u>foster</u> self-awareness for personal growth.

Though with certain established biases.

FYR (for your reference): I am I N F J Introverted, Intuitive, Feeling, and Judging are my prime traits.

Also known as the *Advocate*. This profile suggests I am a *tireless idealist*, sensitive, I care deeply about integrity, with a *strong desire* for authenticity and meaningful connections and I want to make the world a better place.

OK - All that might be pretty accurate...

There is also a relatively newer system created in 1987 (by Alan Robert Krakower) called,

"Human Design" which combines elements from various ancient and modern disciplines to help individuals understand their unique personality, and decision-making processes, along with their life purpose.

Knowing which of the distinct "**Types**" you are can be fundamental to understanding your Human Design as they influence your role, strategy, and purpose in life.

The Four Primary Types are: Manifestor, Generator, Projector, Reflector.

And there is a *hybrid Type*: **The Manifesting Generator.**

Your Type is calculated by using your birth date, time and location.

I, for instance, using that calculation: am a "Manifesting Generator."

Manifesting Generators are described as "Multi-passionate people who are here to do and accomplish many diverse things."

That seems to fit, if you glance at my seeming career diversity for sure!

In fact, I can make meaning out of most of the information provided through <u>various forms of astrology and psychology</u>:

In **Numerology** - at its most basic level of adding together birth date and year - I am a **3**.

The number 3 symbolizes creativity, communication, optimism, and spiritual awareness.

Individuals with strong number 3 energy are said to often be charismatic, artistic, and excel at inspiring others through their words and creative expression.

Here's hoping!:)

Diving a bit deeper into my personal astrology:

My Ascendant or Rising Sign is Gemini.

A mutable air sign.

Gemini Rising. Ruled in the Zodiac Chart by Mercury.

Mercury the closest planet to the sun and rules communication, writing, speech, and intellect.

Geminis have an "innate ability to communicate effectively and connect with almost anyone."

These intermingled as I Enrolled in Ministry School,

Switched Spiritual Direction.

Culminating in my Interfaith Ministry.

Even as I continued with my other work.
